Item Name: Health Open Enrollment Results Program: Health Benefits Item Type: Information Consent

Executive Summary

This agenda item reports California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) member migration between health plans, based on the results of the 2020 Health Benefits Program Open Enrollment period. All 2020 Open Enrollment changes are effective January 1, 2021. In total, 46,677 (3.1 percent) of CalPERS Total Covered Lives (TCLs) changed health plans.

Background

CalPERS annually reports results of the Health Benefits Program Open Enrollment. CalPERS Open Enrollment occurs during the last quarter of each calendar year, offering health plan subscribers the opportunity to make prospective enrollment changes. All 2020 Open Enrollment changes are effective January 1, 2021. This year's results showed decreased transfer rates compared to the year prior. The transfer rate for the 2019 open enrollment period was 5.0 percent. It decreased to 3.1 percent in 2020.

Analysis

CalPERS measured the impact of the 2020 Open Enrollment period by comparing the number of members changing plans effective January 1, 2021, to the December 1, 2020 enrollment counts. This comparison highlights changes due to Open Enrollment.

The following charts display the top three plans that experienced the highest net gain or net loss in enrollment during the 2020 Open Enrollment period. Please note that not all transfers are shown and only the top three movements are displayed. Complete details of member migration between plans as a result of 2020 Open Enrollment are displayed in Attachment 1.
