Thank you. 18 We'll now move on to Item 4, which is the 19 20 Executive Report and for that, we have Mr. Michael Cohen. CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER COHEN: Thank you, Chair. 21 Congratulations. Michael Cohen with the Financial Office. 2.2 23 I just wanted to let you know, as you're well aware, our asset liability management process is 24 25 continuing. You'll be seeing that again in March with

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discussion of implementation, as well as moving on to our 1 affiliate funds, as well as our prefunding trust funds. 2 And so in that regard, I wanted to let the Committee know 3 we're continuing our public outreach to our employer 4 community, doing another webinar, the first or second week 5 of March before the Committee meets, to discuss in 6 particular our prefunding trust funds and what the ALM 7 will have to -- what implications the ALM will have for 8 those funds. 9

10 So with that, I will turn it back to you, Chair, 11 and continue with the agenda.

COMMITTEE MEMBER TAYLOR: Aye. 8 9 COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Madam Chair, I have all ayes, one abstention from Jose Luis Pacheco, with the 10 11 motion being made by Theresa Taylor, seconded by David Miller for Item 5a Finance and Administration meeting 12 minutes for November 16th, 2021. 13 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Thank you, Ms. Hopper. 14 Can we get a motion on 5b. 15 16 COMMITTEE MEMBER TAYLOR: So moved. VICE CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Second. 17 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Ms. Taylor. Second Mr. 18 Miller. 19 20 Any discussion? Roll call, please. 21 COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Rob Feckner? 2.2 23 COMMITTEE MEMBER FECKNER: Aye. COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Frank Ruffino for 24 Fiona Ma? 25

COMMITTEE MEMBER TAYLOR: 9 Aye. COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Madam Chair, I have 10 all ayes for agenda Item 5b, which is the Finance and 11 Administration Committee Delegation, motion being made by 12 Theresa Taylor, seconded by David Miller. 13 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Thank you, Ms. Hopper. 14 We will now move on to Item 6, information 15 16 consent items. And again, Mr. Cohen. CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER COHEN: Yes, Chair. 17 Unless you have any items you wish to pull, these are all 18 consent items. Roughly routine items. It is -- gives me 19 20 an opportunity to mention that our Pension Contracts Unit is now being led by Melody Benavides. Arnita Paige 21 retired at the end of December after three decades of 2.2 23 State service. So I'd like to publicly congratulate her on her retirement as well as Melody's new role. 24 25 But unless there's any discussion on these

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consent items, there's no need for action. 1 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Great. And is there 2 a need for a vote on information consent items? 3 CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER COHEN: There is not. 4 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Okay. Thank you. 5 Then we will move on to Item 7, action agenda 6 7a, 2022 CalPERS Board of Administration State, 7 items. 8 and school, and special retired member elections notice of 9 election. And for that, we go to Mr. Stone. CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER COHEN: And it looks like 10 he might need to be pulled forward. I'm not spotting him. 11 OPERATIONS SUPPORT SERVICES DIVISION CHIEF STONE: 12 I'm here, Michael. 13 CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER COHEN: Okay. 14 Great. OPERATIONS SUPPORT SERVICES DIVISION CHIEF STONE: 15 16 I don't know if you can see me or not yet. CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER COHEN: Yeah, now we can 17 see you and hear you. Go ahead. 18 OPERATIONS SUPPORT SERVICES DIVISION CHIEF STONE: 19 20 Okay. Thank you. Good morning, Madam Chair and members of the 21 CalPERS Board. Dallas Stone, CalPERS team member. This 2.2 23 is an action item seeking Finance and Administration Committee's approval to initiate the 2022 State, school, 24 25 and special retired elections by adopting the respective

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notice of elections. These elections are to fill three seats, the State, school, and retired member on the CalPERS Board.

The State position is held by Theresa Taylor, who has declared her intention to run for reelection. The school position is held by Rob Feckner, who does not intend to run for reelection.

For the retired position, I would like to offer 8 you some background first. On January 16th, 2020, Henry 9 Jones began his four-year term for the retired member seat 10 on the Board. On January 21st, 2022, Mr. Jones resigned 11 from the board, which created a vacancy in his seat prior 12 to the term's expiration. The term will expire January 13 15, 2024. Ordinarily, the election to fill the retired 14 member's seat would be held in 2023. However, following a 15 16 vacancy on the Board during the term of an elected Board member, such as Mr. Jones, Government Code section 20095 17 provides, "The Board shall hold special elections to fill 18 vacancies, which occur during the term of the elected 19 20 members' of the Board. If, at that time, a vacancy occurs, the unexpired term is less than two years, the new 21 member elected to fill that vacancy shall hold office for 2.2 23 a period equal to the remainder of the term of the vacated office plus four years". 24

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At the time Mr. Jones resigned, there were less

than two years remaining on his unexpired term of the current vacancy, therefore the new retired member elected to fill this vacancy will hold office immediately upon certification by the Secretary of State through January 15th, 2028.

If approved, we will release the NOEs, included as attachments 1, 2, and 3 to this item, on March 14th, 2022. At that time, the State and school member NOEs will be transmitted electronically to employers for distribution to active and school members, and the retired member NOE will be mailed directly to retired members. The NOEs will also be available on the CalPERS Board election webpage.

This will also start the nomination period. 14 Nomination petitions containing 250 valid original 15 16 signatures will need to be submitted by May 12th, 2022. All forms related to the nomination requirements will be 17 posted on the CalPERS Board election webpage. Interested 18 19 candidates may also request a copy of the forms directly by contacting the Board election office. I'm happy to 20 answer any questions you may have at this time. 21

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CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Okay. Is there any
discussion, questions from members of the board?
We do have one member of the public who would

like to make public comment with regard to 7a.

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2 STAKEHOLDER RELATIONS CHIEF FOX: Madam Chair, we 3 have one caller, Mr. James McRitchie.

CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Go ahead, Mr. McRitchie.

MR. McRITCHIE: I think that beep was to unmute me. So I've got a few questions. One is with regard to signature collection. Does it have to be a wet signature or can it be an electronic signature. And I do a lot of filing of legal documents. I use a lot of electronic signatures. I don't see any reason why CalPERS members can't use an electronic signature to fill out a form. That's one question.

Another question is the signature forms, when will they be available? My understanding is probably not until March 14th. There is a pandemic. It is loosening up, but it's a difficult environment to go around collecting signatures. I'm wondering if the Board can release the signature documents before March 14th.

And then a third concern is more of a comment is I'm wondering is the Board considering ranked-choice voting in future elections. This, of course, would require a rulemaking change. Not going to happen this year. Probably won't happen for at least a year or two. But ranked-choice voting was taken up by the Board many years ago -- I guess at least 10 years ago. They found

that it could possibly save the Board a million dollars in 1 elections. It seems like a good idea. One of the 2 problems with it, at that point, was certification by the 3 Secretary of State's office, but the Secretary of State's 4 Office is certifying votes elsewhere in the state and 5 ranked-choice voting has increased dramatically since 6 then. We have Alaska, Maine, City of New York, and others 7 8 using ranked-choice voting.

9 And ranked-choice voting also makes elections 10 less contentious, because candidates don't wish to 11 alienate the second choice voter -- the second choice of 12 other candidates.

So those are my questions. Thanks. 13 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Thank you. 14 Do we have any other public comment? 15 16 STAKEHOLDER RELATIONS CHIEF FOX: No, Madam Chair. That is the only public comment for this subject. 17 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: All right. Mr. Stone, 18 19 are you in a position to answer any of the procedural 20 questions that Mr. McRitchie raised? CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER FROST: Ms. Middleton, as 21 public comment, would you be agreeable to having Dallas 2.2 23 follow up directly with Mr. McRitchie?

24 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: I think that's 25 appropriate.

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CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER FROST: Thank you. 1 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: And if there are no other 2 comments, we -- this is an action item. Is there a motion 3 to approve 7a? 4 VICE CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Move to approve. 5 COMMITTEE MEMBER TAYLOR: Second. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Okay. Mr. Pacheco, I see 8 your hand up. 9 COMMITTEE MEMBER PACHECO: I was going to second 10 that. Sorry, apologize. CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Not a problem. 11 All 12 right. Roll call, please. COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Rob Feckner? 13 COMMITTEE MEMBER FECKNER: Aye. 14 COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Frank Ruffino for 15 Fiona Ma? 16 ACTING COMMITTEE MEMBER RUFFINO: 17 Aye. COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: David Miller? 18 VICE CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Aye. 19 20 COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Jose Luis Pacheco? COMMITTEE MEMBER PACHECO: Aye. 21 COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Ramon Rubalcava? 22 23 Excused. Theresa Taylor? 24 25 COMMITTEE MEMBER TAYLOR: Aye.

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1 COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Madam Chair, I have 2 a motion being made by David Miller, seconded by Theresa 3 Taylor for agenda Item 7a, 2022 CalPERS Board of 4 Administration State, school, and special retired member 5 elections notice of election, with all ayes.

CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Thank you, Ms. Hopper.

We now move on to Item 7b, Board Member Employer Reimbursements, an amendment. And for that, we turn to Mr. Cohen.

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10 CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER COHEN: Thank you, Chair 11 Middleton. This item seems action to adjust the 12 reimbursement rates based on the Board President and Vice 13 President elections back in January. You'll see a similar 14 item in April's FAC meeting to adjust for Committee 15 membership, Chairs and Vice Chairs. This is an action 16 item.

17 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: All right. Is there any 18 discussion?

19 I see no discussion. 20 Do we have any public comment on this item? 21 STAKEHOLDER RELATIONS CHIEF FOX: No public 22 comment, Madam Chair. 23 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: All right. Thank you. 24 Is there a motion to approve 7b? 25 VICE CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Move approval.

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COMMITTEE MEMBER TAYLOR: Second. 1 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Mr. Ruffino, you have 2 your hand up. 3 ACTING COMMITTEE MEMBER RUFFINO: I had it to 4 5 move it or to second it, but that's fine, Madam Chair. Thank you. 6 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: All right. Thank you. 7 8 Roll call, please. 9 COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Okay. Madam Chair, can I confirm who the second on this was. 10 11 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Ms. Taylor. COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Okay. I thought so. 12 Thank you. 13 14 Rob Feckner? COMMITTEE SECRETARY HOPPER: Madam Chair, I have all ayes, motion being made David Miller, seconded by Theresa Taylor for agenda item 7b, Board Member employer reimbursement amendment.

CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: All right. Thank you. We will now move on to Item 8a, 2021 CalPERS Board of Administration, member-at-large election results.

9 10 Mr. Stone, please.

OPERATIONS SUPPORT SERVICES DIVISION CHIEF STONE:

Good morning again, Madam Chair and members of 11 the Finance and Administration Committee. Dallas Stone, 12 CalPERS team member. This is an information item on the 13 results from the 2021 member-at-large election. 14 There were two available seats in this election. 15 The Position A 16 seat was decided by a majority vote in the primary election and David Miller was reelected with 72.65 percent 17 of the votes. 18

The Position B seat was decided by a majority vote in the primary election, and Jose Luis Pacheco was elected with 61.76 percent of the votes. Congratulations to Mr. Miller and Mr. Pacheco.

The following is a summary of the -- of the results. The term of office for the elected Board members is January 16th, 2022 through January 15th, 2026. Voter

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turnout for the primary election was 13.36 percent. This is an increase from the 2017 member-at-large election turnout, which was 9.14 percent for the primary election and 10.66 percent for the runoff election. The 2018 public agency member election turnout was 6.4 percent, and the 2019 retired member election turnout was 19.7 percent.

We continue to partner with the Office of Public Affairs and Stakeholder Relations to try to increase voter awareness and participation. A number of those outreach efforts included candidate statement video, toolkits for the employers, spotlight ads and banner on the Inside CalPERS, press releases, social media through Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram messages, and hosting a virtual candidate forum streaming live and placing it on the CalPERS website for future viewing.

16 Attachment 1 provides a breakdown on voter participation demographics, including age group, gender, 17 participation by voting method, and the top 10 cities that 19 voted.

A total of 1,484,291 ballot packages were sent to 20 eligible members and 152,264 paper ballots were returned. 21 There were 38,504 online votes and 5,402 telephone votes. 2.2 23 Voter participation by voting stream in this election was the following: our mail-in votes made up 77.62 percent of 24 25 the total vote; online votes made up 19.63 percent; and

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1 telephone voting made up 2.75 percent. And when you 2 compare these to the 2017 member-at-large primary 3 election, they're very close, almost within a decimal 4 point.

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Looking at a participation by member type, retired members made up 70.48 percent of the total voters who participated. School members made up 12.02 percent, followed by State members at 9.6 percent, and public agency members at 7.87 percent.

Attachment 2 provides a breakdown on voter outreach statistics. This election, members were able to recover their PINs online for the first time ever. Of the total 7,625 PIN requests, 77.6 percent, or 5,922 members utilized this online functionality.

Attachment 3 provides a detailed cost summary of this election. The total cost to conduct the election was \$3.75 million. The cost per eligible voter was approximately \$2.53 per eligible voter, and \$18.92 per yoter based on total votes received.

9 So I just wanted to thank everybody that put this 10 report together. It really clarifies how this works and I 11 think it also kind of gives us an idea that online is 12 getting a little more popular, which is good. So I want 13 to thank everybody that -- of the staff that works on 14 these elections and thank you for putting this report 15 together.

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CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Thank you.

And I'm glad we have as many different methods of being able to vote as we do. That helps get participation. And anything that improves participation is something that we want to very seriously consider. So thank you to Mr. Stone and all the team that was responsible for conducting this election.

And lastly, most importantly, congratulations toMr. Miller and Mr. Pacheco.

And with that, we do have one member of the

public who would like to make a comment. 1 STAKEHOLDER RELATIONS CHIEF FOX: Madam Chair, we 2 have one caller, Mr. J.J. Jelincic. 3 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Mr. Jelincic the floor 4 is --5 MR. JELINCIC: I would like -- oh. Go ahead. 6 7 I would like to also congratulate David and Luis 8 for their election victory. I would like to again point out that online voting violates the California Election 9 10 Code. But the other -- the real question I had was what 11 this Board is doing to collect the money from Priya Mathur 12 that goes back to 2018. It's \$7,425. I do not believe 13 you would have given Jason Perez or Margaret Brown that 14 kind of slack. So my question is what are you doing to 15 16 collect that money. 17 Thank you. CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Mr. Fox, any other 18 callers? 19 20 STAKEHOLDER RELATIONS CHIEF FOX: No, Madam Chair. That concludes public comment. 21 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: So 8a, do we need a vote 2.2 23 on that to move it forward? CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER COHEN: You do not. 24 25 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: All right. Thank you.

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Then we will move on to 8b, which is summary of 1 Committee delegation[SIC]. Mr. Cohen. 2 CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER COHEN: Yes. Mr. Stone 3 will follow up with the public commenter. And that's the 4 only item I recorded. 5 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: All right. Thank you. 6 Do we have any public comment at this time, Mr. 7 8 Fox? STAKEHOLDER RELATIONS CHIEF FOX: No, Madam 9 Chair, we do not. 10 CHAIRPERSON MIDDLETON: Then that brings us to 11 the end of the agenda. And we will adjourn the Finance 12 and Administration Committee at precisely 10 a.m. And the 13 Risk and Audit Committee will -- open session will 14 begin -- as I understand it, Mr. Jacobs, the noticed time 15 16 for Risk and Audit was 10 a.m. And even though that's 45 minutes ahead of when the estimated time is, we can go 17

18 ahead and begin Risk and Audit at the noticed time, is 19 that correct?
