CONTRACTING AGENCY MINIMUM EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTION CALCULATION FOR 2013

2012 Minimum Employer Contribution The Minimum Employer Contribution was originally established as a specific dollar value with specified increases from calendar years 2004 through 2008. Starting in calendar year 2009, the calculated adjustments are based upon the medical care component of the Consumer Price Index-Urban (CPI-U).

Background

California Government Code 22892 of the Public Employees' Medical and Hospital Care Act (PEMHCA)¹ establishes the contracting agencies' minimum health premium contribution for their participating active membership. In addition, this section provides that "commencing January 1, 2009, the employer contribution shall be adjusted annually by the Board to reflect any changes in the medical care component of the CPI-U and shall be rounded to the nearest dollar." The table below displays annual increases of the Minimum Employer Contribution for active members.

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Inflation Rate Changes

In January 2012, the US Bureau of Labor Statistics determined that the annual percentage change in the medical care component of the CPI-U for 2011 was 3.0 percent. The table below provides an inflation comparison of medical care rates since 2007.

Calculation of 2012 Minimum Employer Contribution Using the 3.0 percent increase in the medical care component of the CPI-U, the Minimum Employer Contribution for Calendar Year 2013 is \$115.00. See calculation below.

 $\$112.00 \times 3.0\% = \$3.36 + \$112.00 = \115.36 , rounded to \$115.00).
